**CONSTITUTION**

The Club shall be called DAGENHAM PARK RANGERS hereinafter called "the club"

The aim of the Club is to give children the opportunity to learn and play football and their parents to enjoy watching their children participate in an active sport.

The Clubs colours when playing at home are blue shirts, blue shorts and blue socks and when playing away from home we will play in orange shirts, black shorts and orange socks unless a clash of kits.

The Club shall be affiliated to the Essex county and play in the Echo league.

The Club shall abide by all rules and follow all laws set out by the Essex county and the Echo league.

The Offices of the Club are the Chairman, Secretary and the Treasurer.

All Officers, Managers, Coaches, Parents, Spectators and Players are to abide by the rules set by the Club Officers.

The club is committed to providing equal opportunities regardless of their gender, race, creed and any other condition not relevant to the performance of the club.

**PLAYERS CODE OF CONDUCT**

All PLAYERS are expected to....play because they want to not because they have to. play by the rules of the game. Control your aggression and temper and be responsible for their own behaviour. Use your energy to play better football. Not argue with the referee over a decision they have made...the referees decision is final. Play as a team not an individual, a team performance is more beneficial.

Know the laws of the game and to follow these. Treat all other players as you would expect to be treated yourself. Not to bully or be bullied or take advantage of others. Not use any form of foul language, violence or racism towards anyone. Listen to your manager, without them you cannot learn, train or play matches. Listen and learn, if you don't understand then ask.

Warm up and warm down at all times. Never leave a training session or a match without informing their manager first.

**MANAGERS/COACHES CODE OF CONDUCT**

Managers/Coaches must.....Treat all players as equals

Respect the rights and worth of all Put the well being and safety of all players before anything else. Abide by all the guidelines laid down within the constitution.

Abide by law set by the FA and the Echo league. Develop a trust and good understanding with each player. Make each player understand and accept that the player is responsible for their own behaviour. Make sure that the training provided is acceptable for the teams ability. Make sure they cooperate with any other specialist within the sport. Always promote the codes of conducts to players, parents and spectators alike. Never condone any form of foul language, violence or racism towards anyone. Always display high levels of behaviour and experience, as they are

the role models.

### **PARENTS CODE OF CONDUCT**

Parents must.....accept that their child is playing football because they want to not because they have to. Respect the rights, dignity and worth of others and treat them all equally.

Praise the good of the players and NOT ridicule their failings.

Place the well being and safety of all players above all other.

Follow the rules set by the FA and the Echo league. Encourage players to accept responsibility for their own behaviour and performance. Remember not to argue with referees decisions because a referees decision is final regardless of your opinion, besides they are only human and we are all capable of making a honest error.

Co-operate fully with managers/coaches and all officials. Always display high standard of behaviour as this will encourage our children to do the same.

### **SPECTATORS CODE OF CONDUCT**

Spectators must.....understand that a child involvement in football is purely because they choose to play and are not there for your entertainment. Treat each player equally and not ridicule any player regardless of their performance. Follow the clubs constitution. Encourage players to accept responsibility for their own behaviour as well as their performance. Accept the aspects of the sports fair play charter and never condone violence, foul language and racism towards others. Always display a high standard of behaviour as this will encourage our children to do the same.

### **CLUB RULES**

The Club will not accept any kind of bullying going on between players, parents, managers/coaches or Officers. Should this happen the person(s) responsible will be ask to leave the club with immediate effect.

This Club follows the anti-racism charter and should any racism come to light the Club will ask the person(s) responsible to leave the club with immediate effect.

As part of the terms and conditions agreed with Eastbrook School we are following the no smoking, no drinking and no dogs policy whilst at our home and training ground.

All Officers, Managers/Coaches, Parents, Spectators and Players are to abide by the code of conducts set.

We as a Club follow the RESPECT programme and everyone is expected to abide by it. (Please go to [www.dprfc.com](http://www.dprfc.com) and click on the link to read what the respect programme entails as you will be expected to sign a agreement form)

As of season 09/10 we are changing our subs fees, details will be given and you are to chose your option, sign and return.

No player is allowed is owe no more than two weeks subs, if this happens and the subs are not paid then the manager will be advised and the player will not be allowed to play until the subs are paid.

A home and away kit will be given to each player before the start of the season, each player is responsible for their own kit, if the kit gets damaged outside of a football match the parents are responsible for the cost of replacing the damaged item. (replacements has to be ordered through the

club).

All players are expected to turn up to training and matches on time.

If a player cannot make a training session you are expected to inform the secretary, treasurer or the appropriate manager.

If a player cannot make a match please give as much notice as possible so the manager can make any changes necessary.

At all home games it will be greatly appreciated if all parents can play their part in helping to put up goals, refereeing games (if needed) and making sure all rubbish is picked up when leaving the ground.

At training all managers, players and parents/guardians are responsible for making sure the ground is left litter free, the best way to do this is to make sure you take your litter with you.

With regards to the 11 a side matches, any player that receives a yellow or red card will be responsible for the payment, unless the manager feels it was unduly deserved then the club will come to agreement with the parent.

All managers will be responsible for getting their match day cards in to their allocated divisional officer and will be responsible for any fines they receive regardless of reason (you are old enough to know better)
